Our Missionary Family, the McAuleys: Please see the newsletter sent recently by Luke and Amanda McAuley who serve in Kenya. It is posted in the display case in the back of the sanctuary. One story Luke writes about is how he and Amanda went to a school and were surprised that 50 kids needed wheelchairs. They had no idea how to fill this overwhelming need. Luke writes, "God had a little laugh at me! He responded through a visiting Occupational Therapist who contacted her family, and within the space of a week had raised a significant amount more than what we needed to provide all 50 wheelchairs to these children! Not only did God provide the funds, but He made a break in our schedule that allowed our team to go to [this school]." Luke, Amanda, and their five children will be on home assignment (HMA) back in the states starting December 4. They will be traveling to visit their supporters for the 8 months of their HMA. As their sending church, we will want to do all we can to make their time in the United States a good one. More information will follow as the date of their return approaches.
